

## <u>6 – Comments:</u>

Portugal does not have a national law concerning safety in the Outdoors. No national or regional, sector or activity based programme safety measure has been found either.

The Portuguese approach is therefore based on non-regulatory measures such as sporadic best practices per activity and / or on a local base.

Safety issues in the Outdoors seem to be left very much down to the companies involved as far as management, staff training and customer information are concerned, and down to the European and world conventions and standards as far as management of the environment and equipment safety are concerned.

Portugal has a rather low potential for implementing an overall programme safety policy.

The overall effectiveness of measures related to safety of outdoor leisure activities in Portugal corresponds to pattern N°4.
