

## 6 – Comments :

Estonia does not have a national law that governs the Outdoors in terms of safety. No national or regional, sector or activity based programme safety measure has been found either.

The Estonian approach is therefore very locally based on non-regulatory measures such as codes of conduct per activity.

Safety issues in the Outdoors seem to be left very much down to the individual companies as far as management, staff training and customer information is concerned. European and world conventions and standards seem to be taken into account as far as management of the environment and equipment safety are concerned.

The overall effectiveness of measures related to safety of outdoor leisure activities in Estonia corresponds to pattern N°4.
