

## <u>6 – Comments:</u>

Norway does not have a national law regarding safety in the Outdoors. No national or regional, sector or activity based programme safety measure has been found either. The only regulations available concern specific activities such as Diving and Rafting.

The Norwegian approach seems to be very pragmatic but on the other hand, enforcement is not put into place.

Safety issues in the Outdoors seem to be left very much down to the companies involved as far as management, staff training and customer information are concerned, and down to the European and world conventions and standards as far as management of the environment and equipment safety are concerned.

Norway has a rather low potential for implementing an overall programme safety policy.

The overall effectiveness of measures related to safety of outdoor leisure activities in Norway corresponds to pattern N°3.
